## Making the Most of the CARES Act

Understanding the ways funding allocations can benefit your school

The **Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act** is essential in planning your budget for the next school year.

Central to the CARES Act is the **Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER)** funding. This funding is intended for districts to supplement budgets as districts have to reimagine the way schools may be structured due to COVID-19. This funding can be allocated directly to support students with disabilities. Many STAR programs and services fit the requirements of ESSER and can qualify under ESSER funding within your budget.
